

Stuart Grant Law
It all started as a Norths Junior

Stuart Law was born in Brisbane on 18 October 1968. His dad, Grant Law, was a good cricketer who played premier cricket in Melbourne in the 1960's and Brisbane in the 1970's. In time for the 1976/77 cricket season, Grant was transferred to Townsville with his employment and he was recruited to play for Norths. That season Norths won the A Grade Premiership with Grant scoring an undefeated century in the Grand Final against Wests.

And so it was that Stuart Law commenced his stellar career with humble beginnings as a Norths Junior. His dad was transferred back to Brisbane in time for Stuart to commence playing for Valleys Cricket Club in the 1983/84 season as a 15 year old. In 1984/85 Stuart played for Valleys in a First Grade Premiership win as a 16 year old.

He went on to play for Queensland Under-16 team in 1984/85 season. Also in that team was a Norths Junior, Bruce Ward, who was a very good batsman who later went to play in New Zealand. In 1986/87 Stuart played for Australian Under-19.

The rest is history, as they say, with Stuart going on to score over 40,000 runs in all forms of representative cricket with just over 100 centuries and 200 half centuries.

Let us not forget that he passed through the ranks of Norths Juniors at the commencement of his cricket journey.
